First - the answers to last week's questions

Last week we were looking out for some more unusual things that are not so common and harder to find



This is called a **Pegasus** crossing, and is usually found where a bridle route crosses a road because they are for horses & their riders to cross safely – but you can use this crossing as a normal crossing, when you don't have a horse 😊




This is another type of pedestrian crossing, (look out for one on the road outside Doncaster train station)  
It has a countdown timer, next to red/green man to show the amount of time left to cross the road before the red man appears. This allows pedestrians to decide if they have enough time to cross the road.




These signs are round so they give an order and the red circles mean that something is NOT allowed. In this case vehicles over the sizes/weight shown are not allowed. No vehicles over 4.4m. No vehicles longer than 9.9m. No vehicles wider than 2.0m. No vehicles heavier than 7.5 tons



A triangle sign is a warning sign  
You may see this sign in Sheffield because it tells us that **trams** are crossing ahead



You would see this sign just before some railway tracks cross over the road, this is called a **level crossing**. This sign means - **Level crossing without a barrier**



When out walking, we walk on the pavement, but do you know what the edge of the pavement is called?

It's usually a separate stone like this one.



Have you noticed the lamp posts have numbers on them?
